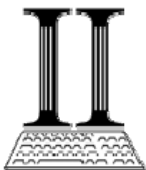

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INTRODUCTION

In 2002, the Information Use Management and Policy Institute (Information Institute) released the report *Public Library Internet Services and the Digital Divide: The Role and Impacts from Selected External Funding Sources*.¹ As part of this study, Appendix B contained an analysis of years two and three of E-rate discount awards to public libraries. In Spring 2003 the American Library Association, Office of Information Technology and Policy (OITP), contracted with the Information Institute to update this analysis of E-rate awards. The objectives of this analysis include the following:

- Update the tables in *Public Library Internet Services and the Digital Divide: The Role and Impacts from Selected External Funding Services, Appendix B*;
- Provide a longitudinal perspective on the E-rate discounts to update the existing data in Appendix B. The data received by the Information Institute enabled the analysis of E-rate discount data from 1999 through February 2002 (E-rate years two through five); and
- Provide a brief written summary explanation of the new tables with overall conclusions and recommendations.

The data and analyses presented in this report address these objectives and provide updated information on E-rate awards to public libraries through 2002.

This report does not provide background information regarding the E-rate program which can be found in *Public Library Internet Services and the Digital Divide: The Role and Impacts from Selected External Funding Sources*.² Nor does this summary provide a literature review or policy analysis of the E-rate program, also contained in the aforementioned report. Readers may also wish to review additional background information about the Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC) that oversees the E-rate program.³

USAC provided the Information Institute with data tables for E-rate years two through five in a Microsoft Access database, current as of February 2003. Members of the study team at the Information Institute loaded these data tables and analyzed the data to provide the various summary tables presented later in the report. Based on these data tables as well as those available to the Information Institute from previous E-rate studies (also provided by USAC), the report offers a number of longitudinal tables describing E-rate awards from 1999-2002.

The data presented in this report are preliminary and were developed specifically to provide the E-Rate Task Force meeting at the American Library Association (ALA) annual conference in Toronto, June 2003, with some summary data for their review and discussion. We stress that the data and analysis presented here are **PRELIMINARY** and are subject to revision in the final report – which is scheduled for publication in early July 2003.

The data also have the following limitations:

- The data for the 2002 E-rate year are current as of February 2003. E-rate data continue to evolve as the Schools and Libraries Division (SLD) resolves a number of applicant/applications issues over time.
- E-rate discounts are not “fixed” in the E-rate year in which applications are submitted. Resolution to discount applications can span E-rate years. For example, for the 1999-2002 E-rate data presented in this summary report, there are still a number of discount applications “pending” – neither denied nor committed (see Figure 6 and Appendix E). This affects the overall numbers presented in this report.
- The data presented are for discount applications that emanated from library/library consortia entities only. As such, these numbers likely underreport what discounts libraries actually receive given that there are a number of libraries that receive E-rate discounts due to their participation in school and library consortia (see Appendix F). The E-rate data are such that it is not possible to determine individual entity discounts when embedded within a multi-type consortium.

Readers should note these limitations as they review the E-rate data presented below.

OVERVIEW OF FINDINGS

Appendices A-F provide summary tables analyzing a range of topics related to the E-rate awards for 1999-2002 (years two through five).⁴ Key findings from these tables suggest the following:

- The 2001 E-rate year appears to be an anomaly when compared to the 1999, 2000, and 2002 E-rate years. In nearly every category – applications made, discount amount requested, etc. – the 2001 year is far greater than any other E-rate year. The authors do not at this time have an explanation for this and would appreciate the insights that the E-rate Task Force may have regarding the 2001 E-rate year.
 - It is important to note that, while the E-rate committed amount for 2001 dipped as compared to other E-rate years, there are still \$40,947,831.74 in pending funding requests for libraries for 2001.
- Libraries have consistently received 3-4% of the total E-rate discounts over the years, ranging from approximately \$55 million to \$66 million in total E-rate Discounts (see Figure 3 and Appendix C).
 - Please note the following: Figure 3 shows that the amount committed to libraries for 2002 is \$55,805,166.05. However, since the time the study team received the data in February 2002, SLD has committed an additional \$9.2 million in E-rate discounts to libraries. Thus, the new total committed amount for 2002 is \$65,041,732.29 (see <http://www.sl.universalservice.org/funding/y5/national.asp>).

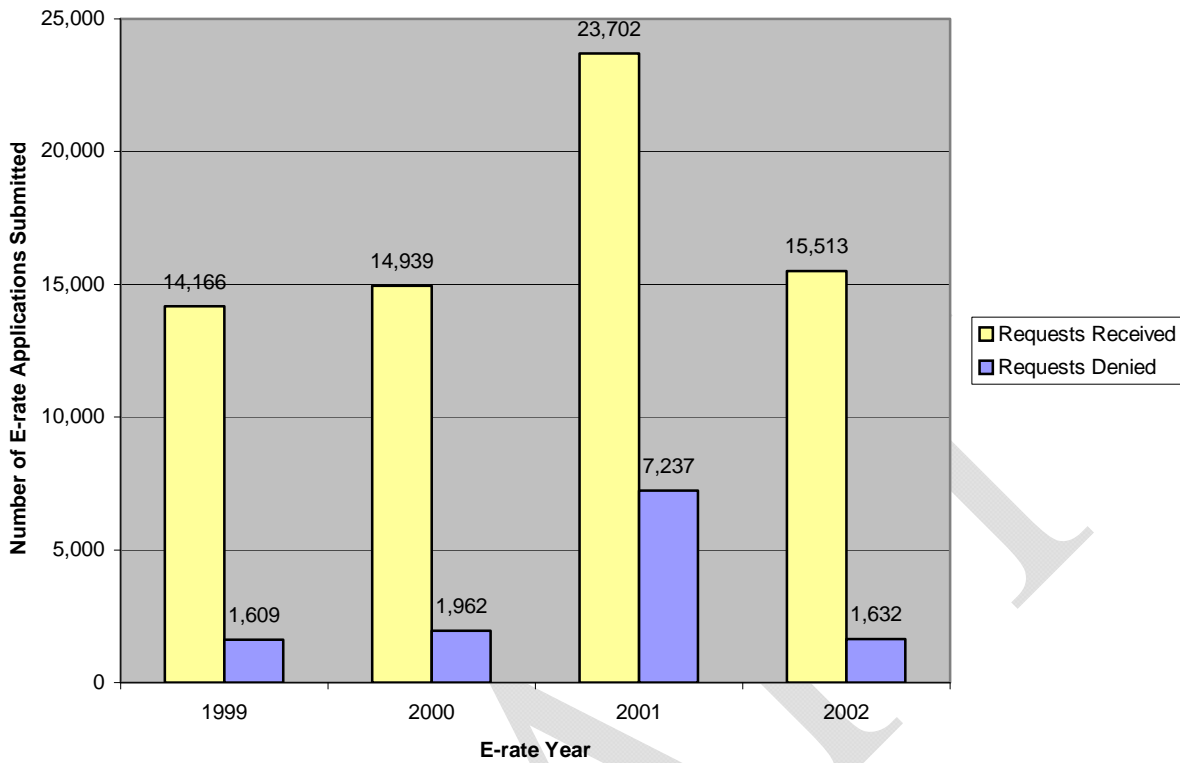


Figure 1. Total Number of E-rate Requests and Denials

- Libraries continue to submit a number of E-rate discount applications, ranging from 14, 166 to 23,702 (see Figure 1 and Appendix A).

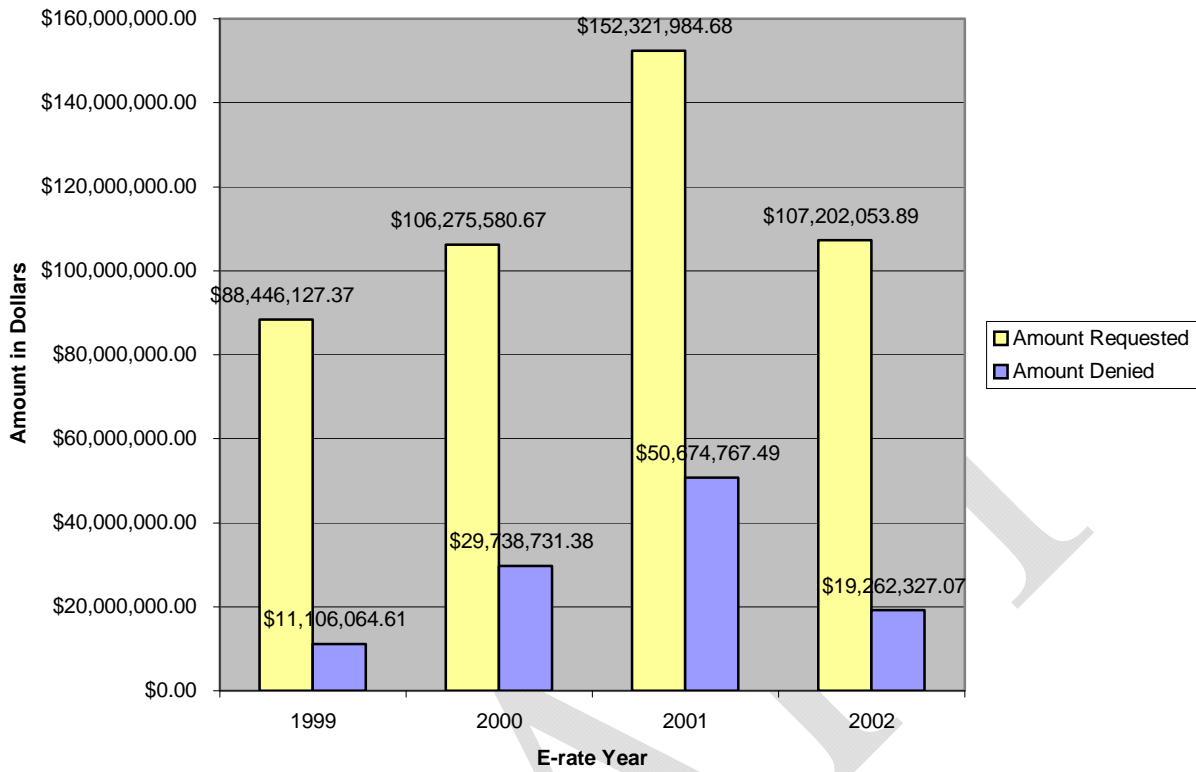


Figure 2. Total Dollar Amounts Requested and Denied

- Library requests denied (as a percentage of total requests) range from 13% to 33% of the total discount amount requested (See Figure 2 and Appendix B).
 - Note: Denied requests can occur for any number of reasons such as incomplete applications, ineligible requests, and lack of funds.

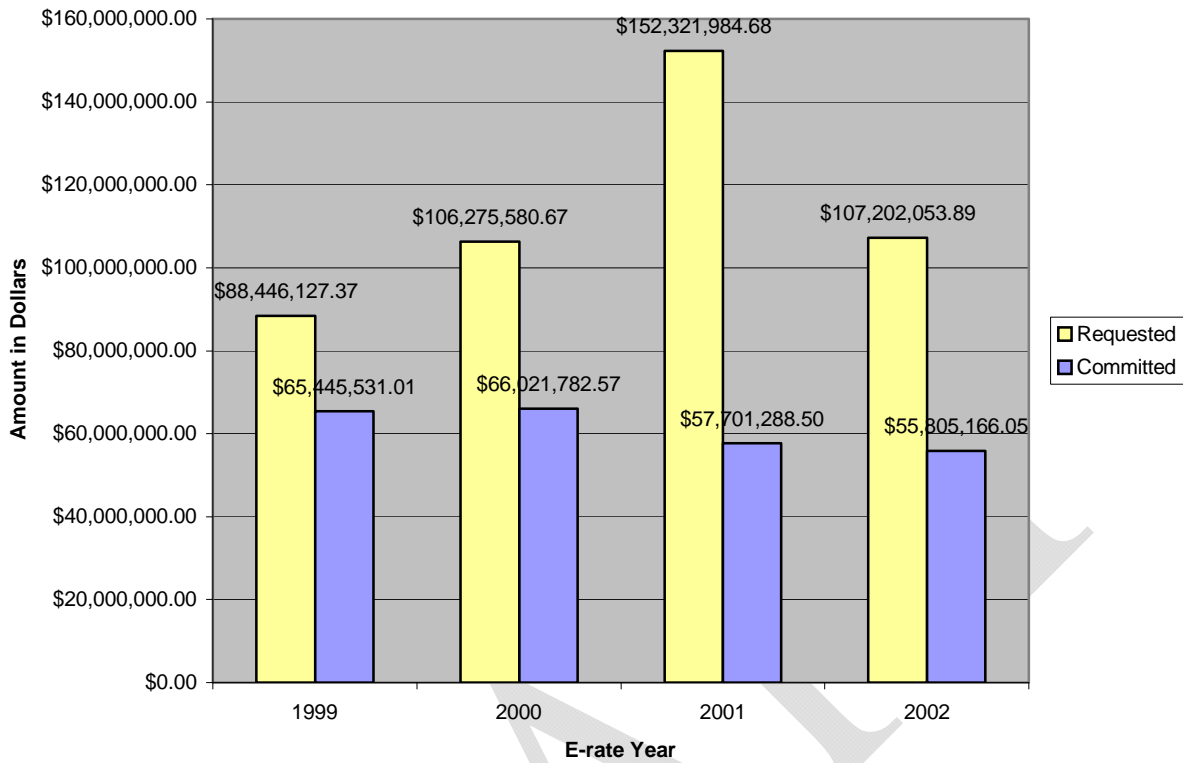


Figure 3. Total Dollar Amounts Requested and Committed

- Library committed discounts range from 38% * to 62% of the total discount amount requested (see Figure 3 and Appendix C).
 - * Percentage for the 2001 E-rate year, which still has \$40,947,831.74 in pending funding requests.
 - Using the February 2002 data, the percentage for 2002 is 52%. However, by using the more recent committed amount of \$65,041,732.29 (see <http://www.sl.universalservice.org/funding/y5/national.asp>), that percentage rises to 61%.
- Internal connection committed discounts range from 13% to 21% of total committed discounts, Internet access committed discounts range from 12% to 29% of total committed discounts, and Telecommunications services discounts range from 53% to 67% of total committed discounts (see Figure 5 and Appendix D).
- There are still discount decisions pending, with a range from \$9,708,429.09 to \$40,947,831.74 (see Figure 6 and Appendix E). Should resolution of these pending discount requests be resolved, it could affect the numbers and percentages presented in this report.
- Libraries may receive additional discounts not identified here due to their participation in school and library consortia. Appendix F provides an analysis of consortia by state. Appendix G provides a further detailing of the data on a state-by-state basis.

These figures show that library discounts remain relatively consistent over the E-rate years two through five, though E-rate year four (2001) remains an outlier that the study team continues to explore.

LONGITUDINAL ANALYSIS

In addition to the yearly tables the study team developed a number of longitudinal tables that reviewed key aspects of the E-rate awards over time. The following report of E-rate data will only review the E-rate funding related to libraries (including public libraries, private libraries, and research libraries with public services and collections and that are not part of an institution of higher education).⁵ These data are drawn from individual applications but are reported in the aggregate by states within school library consortia. These numbers, therefore, are subject to various contextual issues, such as the e-rate funding cycle.

E-rate data for the first four years of the program show that applications for library discounts rose from 14,166 in 1999 to 14,939 in 2000, about a five percent increase (see Figure 1). The next year's applications showed a sharp (37%) increase, with 23,702 submissions in 2001. In 2002, the number of applications decreased to a level similar to that of the first two years, with 15,513 requests (down 35% from 2001 but about a 4% increase in comparison to the number of applications in 2000).

Although the number of requests has increased since the first year of funding, the \$2.25 billion federal allotment for E-rate discounts has not changed. Because of this, the number of requests denied has increased since the first year. Of the \$88,446,127.37 that was requested by libraries for discounts for 1999, 13% was denied (see Figure 2). For 2000, 28% of the total amount requested was denied, 33% for 2001, and 18% of the requested discount dollars for 2002.

Once a request is accepted, the amount requested can be funded in its entirety or in part. In 1999, 74% of the E-rate funds requested were awarded (See Figure 3). In 2000, 62% were awarded, 38% in 2001, and 52% in and 2002.

Note: As of May 14, 2003, the total amount committed for 2002 is now \$65,041,732.29, as the SLD resolved a number of outstanding application issues for selected applications.

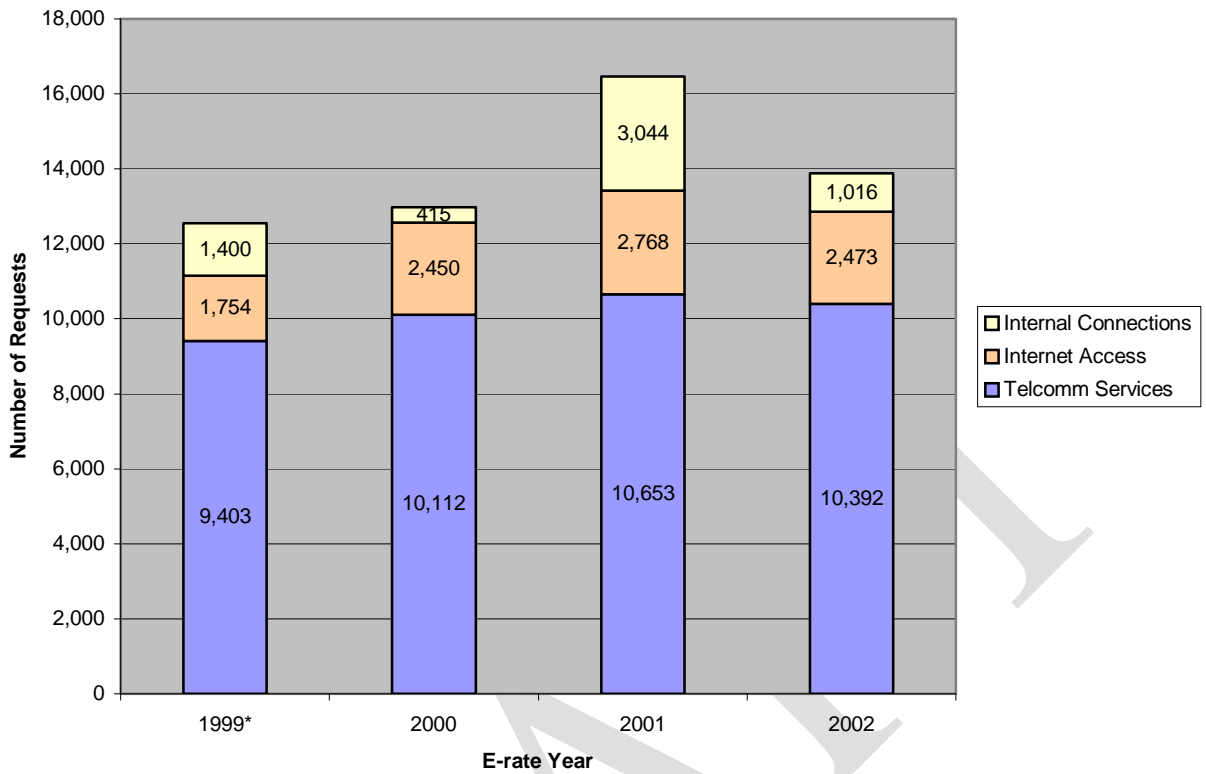


Figure 4. Types of Services Requested and Funded

Of the three types of service discounts requested and funded, Internal Connections has shown the most variation in the four years (see Figure 4). The amount of funding requested has varied between approximately \$88.5 million in 1999 and \$152 million in 2001. However, the amounts committed are a much closer range, from approximately \$55 million in 2002 to approximately \$66 million in 2000. As a result of these varied ranges, the amounts requested and the amounts committed are not proportional across E-rate years.

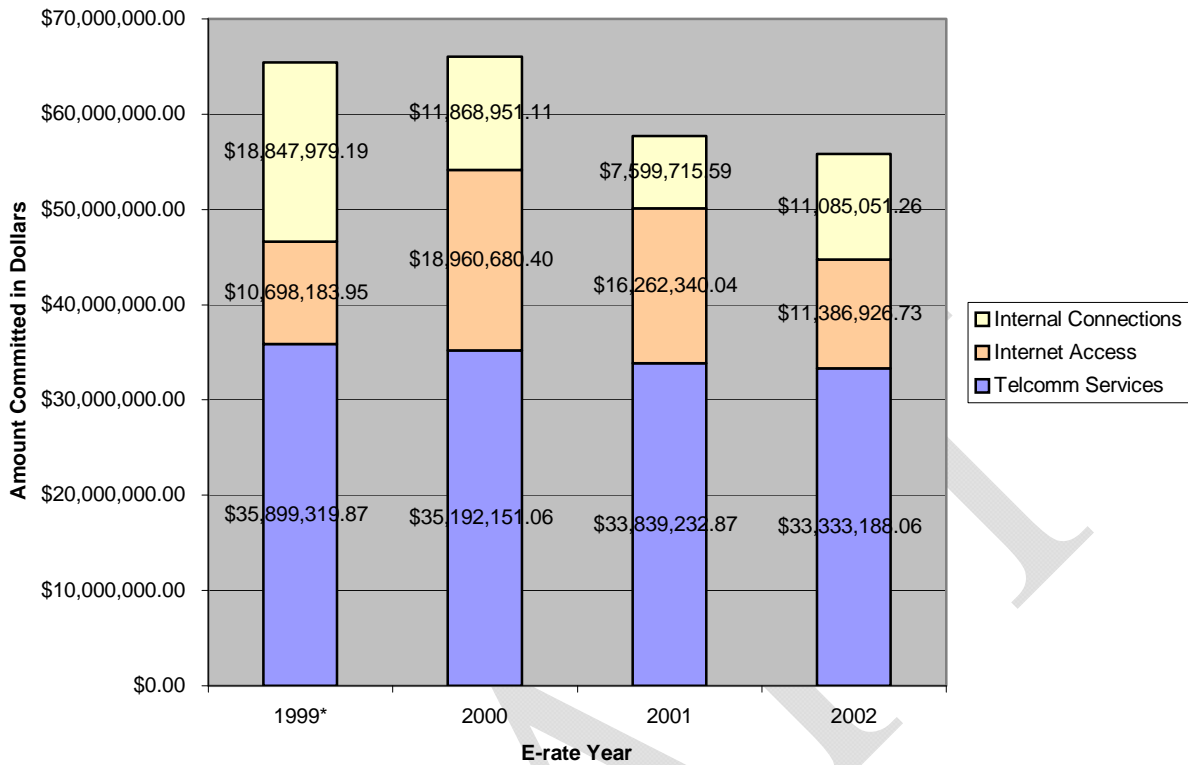


Figure 5. Amount Committed for the Types of Services Requested

The dispersion of these funds among the three types of services can be seen in Figure 5. It is clear by comparing the Figures 4 and 5 that, although the number of requests accepted, for example, for Internal Connections increased from 2000 to 2001, the amount of funds committed decreased during this same period. In other words, the number of requests accepted does not necessarily reflect the amount of discount dollars committed to the type of service.

A comparison of the number of requests in Figure 4 and the amount of committed funding in Figure 5 demonstrates that there is limited correlation between the number of requests and the amount of money committed for internal connections and for Internet access. The number of requests and the amount committed has remained fairly steady for Telecommunications services.

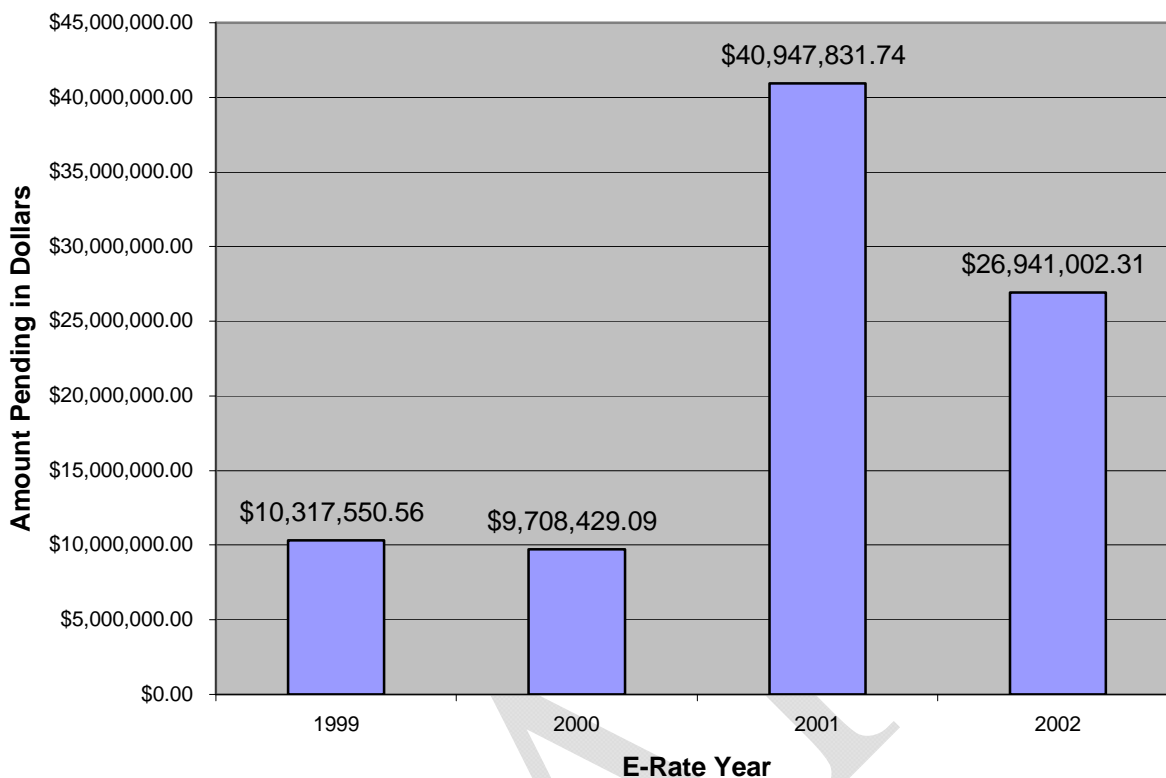


Figure 6. Pending Discount Requests for E-rate Years 1999-2002

Figure 6 reveals that there are still a considerable number of requests pending from each E-rate year. The amount pending from years 2001 and 2002 is particularly sizeable. Other datasets in this report may be affected based on the resolution of these amounts, either as committed funds or as rejections.

As previously noted, the numbers presented in this report do not reflect the resolution of any pending requests subsequent to February 2003. Any pending requests that have since been funded would change E-rate figures where relevant. As a result, there may be some differences between the numbers in this report and the numbers that are currently reported by the USAC.

SUMMARY AND AREAS FOR FURTHER RESEARCH

Other than the seemingly anomalous data from the 2001 E-rate year, the data library discount data for 1999, 2000, and 2002 indicate that libraries:

- Submitted between 14,166 and 15,513 (with an average of 14,873) applications each funding year;
- Had a range of 1,609 to 1,962 requests denied each of those three years;
- Requested approximately \$100 million each of those three years; and
- Received a commitment in discounts during those three years that ranged from \$66,021,782.57 to \$55,805,166.05 (note that since receipt of these data, libraries received an additional \$9.2 million in committed discounts for 2002, bringing the total for 2002 to \$65,041,732.29. This redefines the range from \$65,041,732.29 to \$66,021,782.57).

The overall library e-rate discount process, therefore, remains relatively consistent in most aspects.

The data for the 2001 E-rate year, however, vary considerably from that of the other three years. In reviewing the data for 2001, one notes that library E-rate discount applications:

- Increased significantly;
- Included a large jump in total dollar amount funding requests; and
- Demonstrated a higher amount of rejected requests that coincides with the increased number of applications and requested funding amounts.

It is important to note that there are nearly \$41 million in pending funding requests for libraries for the 2001 E-rate year. Thus, while 2001 shows a decrease of committed funding to libraries (\$57,701,288.50) as compared to other E-rate years, it is possible that discount awards to libraries may increase as pending applications are resolved.

The reasons for the substantial difference in applications and funding for the 2001 E-rate year cannot be ascertained from the E-rate datasets received by the authors.

The Schools and Libraries Consortia Issue

This report underreports the total E-rate discount amount received by libraries. The report presents data analysis for library applicants designated as a “library or library consortia.” It is also possible for libraries to receive E-rate discounts should they apply through a school and library consortium. The E-rate data structure is such that it is possible to ascertain school and library consortia applications, the aggregate amount requested, and the members of the consortia application. It is not possible, however, to determine what amount each member applicant (e.g., a library within a consortium) received of the aggregate amount. We are able to determine the number of consortia and libraries within those consortia, but are unable to estimate the total amount of discounts received by libraries that are a part of a multi-type consortium.

Future Research

These data raise many questions that could be future areas of research regarding libraries and the E-rate program, including:

- What is the actual amount of E-rate discount funding that libraries receive?
 - What is the extent of underreporting of library discounts received due to library participation in multi-type school and library consortia?
- What factors contribute to the discount funding of certain services over others?
 - Is more funding being requested in that area or some other factors?
 - Why are more requests denied for certain types of services (Internal Connections and Internet Access)?
 - Why is funding going down for Internet Connection and Internet Access as the number of requests increase?
 - Are libraries not able to qualify fully for internal connection funding due to the discount level requirements imposed by SLD?
- Why have the levels of Telcomm Services requests and funding remained fairly steady through the program?
 - What does this reveal about the needs of libraries, if anything?
- What factors contribute to the high number of pending requests from each year of the program?
 - Are there application/implementation issues?
 - Applicant issues?
- What factors contribute to funding request denials (e.g., incomplete applications, ineligible requests, lack of funds, other)?
- What factors caused the dramatic differences in the data from the 2001 E-rate year?
 - What do these differences reveal?
- Given the number and amount of requests, especially in 2001, does the amount of the funding going to libraries need to be increased to reflect the levels of interest in the program?
- What do the data demonstrate about the state of libraries in terms of levels of need for information technology?

There are other questions as well, but the above set forth a substantial series of research questions regarding the E-rate that require further exploration in order to get a more comprehensive view of the E-rate and libraries.

The Consortia Piece

A key issue in the analysis of E-rate discounts is identifying the extent of library discounts received through participation in school and library consortia. It is not possible to attain these data from the SLD/USAC E-rate maintained data for reasons identified above. These data reside within states and the consortia themselves, and the best way to determine the amount of public library awards that went specifically to public libraries through consortia and similar cooperatives is to conduct site visits at four or five such consortia in different regions of the country. While the findings cannot be generalized to the entire country, they can provide some

critical information as to how E-rate requests and awards from consortia and cooperatives are being developed, used, and awarded. These findings may also yield a generalizable method that the other non-participating states could follow, with the reports of those states helping to create a fuller picture of the impact of consortia.

To complete such a study would require the development of a method to identify and disaggregate request and award information from the consortia, cooperatives, or in some instances from the state library. Until such a study is conducted, there is no way to estimate the underreporting of library E-rate discount receipt. Or, said differently, without such a study, researchers, policymakers, and practitioners will not know how much libraries actually receive in E-rate discounts.
